**First Full LARC meeting, new member*

LARC Officer Election Ballots for Secretary nominee Cristy Cash and Treasurer nominee Brian Wolff were distributed at sign-in. Voting members who wished to receive a ballot checked beside their name on the LARC Voting Member sign-in sheet and wrote their organization name in the blank.

- I. Christa Figgins called the meeting to order at 12:07 and welcomed everyone.
- II. Print copies of the minutes were not provided for review & approval was tabled until next meeting.
- III. **Program Coordinator Report, Caroline Wiegman:**
 - A. January's Speed Sharing event was a success, 58 people attended, 28 presented in about 75 minutes, 21 were new, and the resulting resource list is on the website (www.oklarc.org).
 - B. We are overhauling LARC's membership process and I will contact you each soon to update membership info.
 - C. The Moore Girl's Softball Association (MGSA) is helping affected coaches and players get back to a new normal this season with a fully renovated ballpark. The City of Moore is funding field and facility renovations but MGSA is looking for support on several projects they are outside the City's budget: a memorial bench for a player lost in Plaza Towers on May 20th, batter and pitcher warm-up cages, and equipment for the concession stand that meets Health Department requirements. *Contact Caroline (oklarc@oklarc.org) for more details. - IV. **Announcement:** Serve Moore Community Renewal Center, Chris Fox: Thursday, February 24th the grand opening celebration begins at 3:00 at the Original Headquarters in Covenant Life Assembly's Gym to thank them for their partnership and service to the community. Then at 3:30, ribbon cutting at the new Community Renewal Center (224 S Chestnut, Moore) followed by a reception and open house! Everyone in the community is welcome to join for either or both celebrations!
- V. **Oklahoma Disaster Recovery Project, Robin Eddy:** Report on the number of open and closed cases in the LARC service area, ODRPs recent reduction in force, and total amount funded through ODRP.

VI. **Communities Advancing Resilience Toolkit (CART), Terrorism and Disaster Center (TDC), Dr. Rose Pfefferbaum:** Rose encouraged everyone to consider that there are many definitions for resilience. Within CART, resilience is the ability to recover from adversity, so the term actually includes long-term disaster recovery because recovery cannot occur without resilience. Also, CART focuses on community resilience vs individual resilience because you can have a community where all of its individuals/households are 100% resilient but the community itself is not resilient. For instance, after a disaster, if most of the individuals in a community decide to move away, the community will not recover and is not a resilient community even if the individuals who moved were all 100% resilient and may have moved as part of healthy recoveries. After completing the CART survey (answering questions from the perspective of a community member in the LARC service area), we reviewed results from a previous TDC project with Red Cross. Rose pointed out how interpreting survey results within the community context helps build a community narrative that allows a community to describe where it would like to be; develop attainable goals and action plans to get there; identify which CART tools to include in action plans; and implement plans to accomplish goals. The process is initiated by the community, in this case initiated by LARC. After reviewing the available CART instruments/tools, Rose emphasized that the tools and other information presented today are not part of a preset process but the LARC community would choose the CART process that works for them. Rose also emphasized that, at the very least, she hopes to come back to discuss today's survey results with LARC and, beyond that, hopes that LARC will want to work with her to apply the CART process.
